Know Your Neighbor

1. List several things in this world that people tend to “see” as their savior.
2. Explain in your own words (without Christian clichés) why these things really cannot save.

Know God’s Word

1. Reflect on the passage and in one or two sentences give a brief synopsis of the sermon last Sunday. (Write down and discuss any significant points or principles)
2. Re-read Matthew 19:16-22
 - a. Did this man see Jesus as his savior? Why or why not?
 - b. What or who was his savior?
 - c. List the differences between our blind men and this man in how they viewed Jesus.
 - d. Who has the better “view” of where they stand? (ironically)
 - e. Why do you suppose this is true?
 - f. Write out an appropriate view that we ALL should have of Jesus.

Know How to Live

1. Can a *believer* treat something else besides Jesus as their savior?
2. What are some examples you can think of where we can and should make Jesus our savior instead of what the world would suggest?
3. If you can, give an example from your own life where you treated something other than Jesus as your “savior.” (thinking if this “THING” would just happen, then you would be “all set”)
 - a. What is the danger in this type of thinking?
